### From the President

I was on vacation from June 26 to July 11 so I missed both the horrendous storm and heat wave that the rest of you had to suffer through. Dora Pugliese emailed me photos of the extensive tree damage. Fortunately, our mutual did not lose electrical service as did those living outside of Leisure World and thankfully damage to our homes and vehicles was minimal. Let's hope that the weather will be much less extreme for the rest of the summer. I want to thank those mutual board of directors members who handled the phone calls and concerns of our residents following the storm.

For this month I have a several items to share with you:

**Street Paving Update:** Final negotiations are underway with Brothers Paving and Concrete, Inc. to include some changes in the contract we are making with them. The negotiations are going smoothly and by the time you get this newsletter we expect to have a signed and ratified contract. As discussed in last month's newsletter, the contract will include the paving of an 860-foot-long section of Kelmscot Drive, all of

Deerhurst Terrace and Densmore and Hallaton Courts. The Kelmscot section will be from the intersection of Kelmscot and Leisure World Boulevard that is closest to Connecticut Avenue. Broken curbing along paving areas will be replaced as well. PPD's Special Projects unit will oversee the project and ensure that it proceeds with as little inconvenience as possible to those of you who will be affected by the work. Brothers Paving and Concrete has done large paving projects for major corporations (Marriot Corp.), the federal government (including paving at the Pentagon), apartment complexes and shopping centers and are highly qualified to carry out our paving needs. The company provides the paving and concrete work for Grady Management, which manages many major apartment complexes in the Washington DC area. To be selected by Grady Management gives us a high level of confidence that Brothers will provide us with a high quality and durable product at a reasonable cost. Residents interested in knowing more about the company can visit their website at [www.brotherspaving.com](http://www.brotherspaving.com). **Residents affected by the construction will be notified well in advance since there will be no on-street parking during the period of construction. Violators will have to be towed away to avoid disruption of the work.** Right now it appears that the work will take place in the late-August to early-September timeframe and should take about two days.

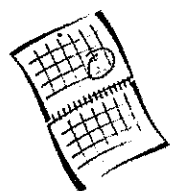
**Sidewalk Repairs:** Physical Properties Division has completed a mutual-wide project of grinding and caulking, as needed, the sidewalks throughout the mutual. The grinding was done to remove tripping hazards at sidewalk joints that had shifted up or down because of settling, roots, etc.

The caulking was done to close up cracks in the cement to prevent their further deterioration because of the freezing-thawing process during the winter.

**Volunteers come forward:** In last month's newsletter, we asked for volunteers to deliver the Leisure World News and our mutual's newsletter. I am grateful for the responses we have gotten. Betty Eisenhour will be taking over Jack Baker's route that includes Densmore Ct and Deerhurst Terrace, Betty and Stu VanScoyoc have volunteered to substitute as needed, Bob and Sue Busch indicated they would take on a route as primaries or be available to substitute and Terri Fiscella indicated she's available as well. I very much appreciate the response. We will be getting information to each volunteer about what residences are included in each route so that substitutes will know what homes to deliver. Once again -- thanks.

**New Supervisor of PPD Special Projects:** Ronny Cabrera has been selected from roughly 100 applicants to replace John LaClere who recently retired. Ronny has extensive experience in both the residential and commercial construction fields and we look forward to working with him.

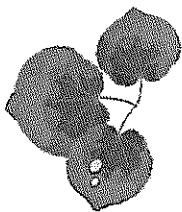

**Emergency Preparedness:** This is the third in a series of suggestions regarding emergency preparedness measures you should take. Following them is in your best interests.

1. **Alert Montgomery:** Those of you with internet service or texting capability can sign up for this free county service at <https://alert.montgomerycountymd.gov>. When an incident or emergency occurs, authorized senders can notify you using Alert Montgomery. ( Severe weather warnings or heavy traffic congestion are examples of the types of alerts that can be announced via this service). Alert Montgomery provides you with your own personal connection to updates, instructions on where to go, what to do (or what not to do), who to contact and other important information. The service is very flexible and allows you to choose what types of information (e.g., severe weather warnings) that you wish to be notified about. To register for the service open the above link and chose New User. For more information about the program see the copy of the site's home page which is attached to our newsletter. A flyer which gives more detail about the service is attached.
2. **Emergency Preparedness Measures Within the Home:** Roma Sohn, our mutual's representative on Leisure World's Emergency Preparedness Committee, wrote an article on common household hazards and the precautions to take to eliminate them. A copy of her article is attached to this newsletter.

**This alert system is administered by the Montgomery County Office of Emergency Management and Homeland Security. Please click on "New User" to begin your registration!**

Montgomery County can use the Roam Secure Alert Network to contact you during a major crisis, emergency, or severe weather event. Residents who register on this system will receive only the most urgent alerts (e.g. Water main break, Tornado Warning) if they do not register for other optional groups. Alert Montgomery can deliver important emergency alerts, notifications and updates to you on all of your devices at once:

- e-mail account (work, home, other)
- cell phone
- text pager
- BlackBerry
- wireless PDA
- XM Radio Channel 214
- Twitter: Add "Montgomery County MD" in find people
- Facebook: Add "Montgomery County MD" in friends
- Facebook: Add "Montgomery County MD Office of Emergency Management and Homeland Security" in friends
- Text MONTGOMERY to 411911

When an incident or emergency occurs, authorized senders can notify you using Alert Montgomery. This is your personal connection to updates, instructions on where to go, what to do, or what not to do, who to contact and other important information.

While signing up for Alert Montgomery is free of charge, your wireless carrier may charge you a fee to receive text messages. Please check on the FAQ link (left column), and your wireless service agreement, to review your carrier's pricing scheme.

If you are a new user and live in the City of Takoma Park, Rockville or Gaithersburg please sign up on those alerting systems by clicking on the following links. Some alerts from this county system will be automatically relayed onto these cities' systems :

## **Safety in the Home - Part 4- Common Household Hazards (by Roma Sohn)**

This part of the “Safety in the Home” series will examine everyday household hazards.

Home appliances such as irons, hair dryers, electric stoves and ovens, microwaves, toasters, washing machines and dryers, television sets, radios and record/CD/DVD players, can be sources of electrical fires. Negligence and errors cause many candle fires.

Many other things can be sources of dangerous conditions around the house.

Here are some suggestions for a safer home:

- Routinely check your appliances and wiring
- Replace all worn, old, dried up, or damaged electrical cords. Do not just put tape around the worn area.
- Avoid using extension cords as much as possible. Never overload an extension cord.
- Keep electrical appliances away from wet countertops and floors, sinks, showers and bathtubs.
- Keep clothing, curtains and any potentially combustible item at least 3 feet away from a hot appliance
- If an appliance has a three- prong plug, use it only in a three- slot outlet. Never force it into a two- slot outlet or extension cord.
- Never overload wall sockets.
- Any light switches or wall sockets that are loose or hot to touch and /or lights that flicker, need professional attention. Immediately shut off the lights or whatever is connected to the wall socket and do not use any malfunctioning item until it has been professionally serviced.
- Check electrical tools regularly for signs of wear. Replace cracked or frayed cords and replace the tool if it overheats, shorts out, gives off even small electrical shocks, smoke or sparks.
- Use the appropriate size power and/or extension cords to carry the load of any power tools
- Do not use a light bulb with wattage that is too high for the fixture. Look for the label inside each fixture which tells its maximum wattage
- When buying electrical appliances, look for products that have been evaluated by a nationally recognized laboratory, such as Underwriters Laboratories (UL)
- Dryers must be vented to the outside, not into a wall or attic. Vents must be cleaned periodically. Lint screens should be cleaned after each use.
- Never leave home with appliances running.
- Do not trap electrical cords against the wall, run them under rugs or twist them around a nail or hook
- Allow air space around the TV, radio, stereo and powerful lamps to prevent overheating.
- Don't use extension cords with space heaters and never leave the room when space heaters are on. Keep them in good repair and at least 3 feet from the wall and any newspapers or other combustible materials.
- Make certain that your space heaters have a “tip switch” (switches that are designed to shut off the heater if it accidentally tips over.)
- Check electric blanket wires and cords for signs of aging or fraying
- Watch for signs of overloaded electrical systems such as dimming lights when an appliance goes on, a shrinking TV picture, slow heating appliances, frequent fuses or circuit breakers blowing. If you see any of these, call an electrician
- Stay in the kitchen when you are frying, grilling or broiling food.
- Insure that candles are in sturdy metal, glass or ceramic holders, placed where they cannot be easily knocked over. Whenever possible, place them on a fireproof tray.
- Make certain that lit candles are not near any combustible materials or under cabinets
- Don't use candles for light
- Extinguish candles after use
- Never leave burning candles unattended
